UPDATE: SUMMER PROJECTS

## THANKS FOR GOING WITH THE *FLOW*, MISSOULA.

Mountain Water Company completed several infrastructure improvement projects this summer. And we'd like to thank area residents and businesses for your patience and understanding. This year's \$4 million capital improvement program helped to reduce leakage, ensure quality and bolster reliability. ### MADISON STREET PROJECT

Replaced two aging lines with a new 24-inch line, plus used directional drilling to install a new 12-inch main across Madison Street with minimal disruption to traffic. Project included assisting in landscaping a previously bare concrete median near the bridge.

### OWEN-BROADWAY PROJECT

New 8-inch and 12-inch mains – replacing an 80-year-old, 6-inch water main – that feed the Providence St. Patrick Hospital complex, improving flow and reliability to the facility and surrounding area.

### HAWTHORNE STREET PROJECT

Replaced an aging 3-inch steel main with a new 8-inch ductile iron main and a new fire hydrant to serve the proposed new Poverello Center and surrounding customers.

### HILLVIEW WATER TANK

Installed a 300,000-gallon, state-of-the-art prestressed concrete tank to serve customers while allowing for future rehabilitation of the aging tank onsite.

### FIRE HYDRANT REPLACEMENTS

Installed 10 new hydrants, replacing outdated hydrants with modern hydrants that have higher capacity nozzles to better assist the Missoula Fire Department when fighting fires.



During each of these projects, Mountain Water's Water Wagon provided temporary water service for restaurants and salons to ensure they could stay in business during water shutdowns.



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
